Online Guide to Free Legal Help for Low-Income People

Louisiana's LawHelp site (LouisianaLawHelp.org) is free. Southeast Louisiana Legal Services administers LouisianaLawHelp.org, with support, information and resources contributed by advocacy groups, pro bono organizations, and social service providers.

How do I use the site?

Go to LouisianaLawHelp.org. The home page has a slide show to show you how the site works. Click on any topic or picture to look for information. Some information is available in other languages.

How can the site help me?

Here are some features of LouisianaLawHelp.org:

Self Help Court Forms: including links to a computer program that helps draft court forms.

Legal Program Directory: list of free and low-cost legal aid programs in Louisiana. Search by parish or program name.

Know Your Rights: general information about legal issues.

Self-Help: forms and links for services and benefits.

Helpful Resources: look for social services or other help.

Find Courts: search by city, ZIP code or parish.

Find a Lawyer: search by city, ZIP code or parish.

LiveHelp: “talk” online with a navigator trained to help you find information on the site.

What sort of information can I find on the site?

There is information for at least 14 broad topics, including family, housing, consumer, employment, and government benefits. Information

generally focuses on the concerns of low-income people.

Can I get legal advice through the Web site?

No. You cannot get legal advice on the site. You may find information you need on the site. If you need a lawyer, the Legal Program Directory on the site can help you find the nearest free legal services program.
